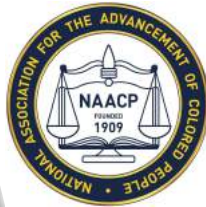
We also have a direct responsibility to ensure the community is equipped and prepared to engage in the democratic process via voter education, GOTV activities and civic education/engagement.
